Turned over to the prosecutor's office were two brief segments, totaling less than five withhold portions. minutes, from the tape of a June 30, 1972, luncheon meeting involving President Nixon, former aide H. R. Haldeman and former Attorney General John N. Mitchell.

Originally, the White House had requested that the entire conversation be withheld but later agreed to turn over the brief segments during which Watergate was discussed.

Also received by the prosecutor was a 33-minute and 9second portion of a Sept. 15, 1972, meeting involving the President, Haldeman and former White House counsel John W. Dean III.

The White House made no request to withold that segment during which it said the conversation dealt almost entirely with Watergate.

Sirica also gave the prosecutors verbatim transcripts of two recordings of personal recollections dictated by Mr. Nixon.

One was a Dictabelt of the President's recollections of a telephone conversation with Mitchell on June 20, 1972. That conversation, subpoenaed by the special prosecutor, was not on a telephone included in the White House taping system.
