U.N. Meeting On Chile

United Nations

Cuba asked last night for an urgent meeting of the U.N. Security Council on its complaint of attacks by Chile's military on the Cuban Embassy in Santiago and on a Cuban vessel.

Any debate is expected to range over the late President Salvador Allende's Marxist government, its charges of political meddling by U.S. corporations and Tuesday's military coup in Santiago.

Teofilo Acosta, charge d'affaires of the Cuban U.N. mission, handed the written request to Yugoslav Ambassador Lazar Mojsov, council president for September.

Acosta said Mojsov told him he would consult other council members immediately on the request.
