NEW ORLEANS, MARCH 12 (AP)-ATTORNEYS FOR BUSINESSMAN CLAY L. SHAW, ACCUSED BY DIST. ATTY. JIM GARRISON OF CONSPIRING TO KILL PRESIDENT KENNEDY IN 1963, WILL OFFER NEW MOTIONS IN THE CASE TOMORROW BEFORE A SPECIAL THREE-JUDGE STATE PANEL.

THE PANEL WHICH GRANTED THE SPECIAL HEARING WILL PRESIDE TUESDAY AT A PRELIMINARY HEARING TO DETERMINE WHETHER THERE IS SUFFICIENT EVIDENCE TO JUSTIFY PUTTING SHAW ON TRIAL.

SHAW, FORMER MANAGING DIRECTOR OF THE OLD INTERNATIONAL TRADE MART IN NEW ORLEANS, WAS THE FIRST MAN ARRESTED IN GARRISON'S INVESTIGATION OF THE KENNEDY ASSASSINATION.

GARRISON CONTENDS THAT A NEW ORLEANS CONSPIRACY CULMINATED IN THE ASSASSINATION IN DALLAS, TEX. SHAW DENIED ANY KNOWLEDGE OF ANY SUCH PLOT.

THE DISTRICT ATTORNEY CLAIMS THAT LEE HARVEY OSWALD, NAMED BY THE WARREN COMMISSION AS THE LONE ASSASSIN OF KENNEDY, MET WITH SHAW AND OTHERS IN NEW ORLEANS IN SEPTEMBER, 1963, TO PLOT KENNEDY'S DEATH.

GARRISON SAID A "CONFIDENTIAL INFORMANT" WAS PRESENT AT THE MEETINGS.

CRIMINAL DISTRICT COURT JUDGE BERNARD BAGERT INDICATED LAST WEEK THAT GARRISON WOULD BE ASKED TO HAVE HIS INFORMANT AVAILABLE AT THE PRELIMINARY HEARING.
