# Enid Man Tells Prober Of Assassination Scene

James Hicks, 27, an enid man, told the assassination scene was "a very busy" one. He said he saw people coming from both directions and in addition to the firing from the Texas school depository building.

they were the ones he saw on the knoll or if they are Garrison suspects.

Hicks said he was about 30 feet from the presidential limousine and saw more than one person on the arcade above the knoll and "something similar" to a weapon or weapons.

Jim Alcock, assistant dis-

trict attorney in New Orleans, confirmed Hicks' appearance before Garrison's investigators, but he said he understands Hicks volunteered. Alcock said there is a possibility Hicks may be asked to return.

The official declined to say what information Hicks gave.
