NEW ORLEANS (AP) -- A PREVIEW OF THE DEFENSE OF CLAY L. SHAW, ACCUSED OF CONSPIRING TO ASSASSINATE PRESIDENT JOHN F. KENNEDY, IS EXPECTED IN CRIMINAL DISTRICT COURT HERE WEXT WEEK.

JUDGE EDWARD A. HAGGERTY JR. WEDNESDAY SET A PRE-TRIAL HEARING FOR MONDAY, AND THE DEFENSE SUBPOENAED 33 WITNESSES.

SHAW, 54, A RETIRED NEW ORLEANS BUSINESSMAN, HAS PLEADED INNOCENT. A THREE-JUDGE PANEL RULED THERE WAS SUFFICIENT EVIDENCE TO BIND SHAW OVER FOR TRIAL, AND THE GRAND JURY RETURNED AN INDICTMENT CHARGING HIM WITH CONSPIRACY.

BEFORE THE JURY NOW IS A MOTION TO QUASH AND A SUPPLEMENTAL MOTION TO QUASH. JUDGE HAGGERTY SAID HE WOULD RULE SEPT. 18 ON THE DEFENSE MOTION TO QUASH THE INDICTMENT.

THE STATE WEDNESDAY FILED ITS ANSWER TO THE SUPPLEMENTAL MOTION TO QUASH. GARRISON'S AIDES TOOK THE SAME POSITION THEY HAD TAKEN IN THE REQUEST OF SHAW'S ATTORNEYS FOR A BILL OF PARTICULARS IN SUPPORT OF ITS CONTENTION THAT SHAW WAS INVOLVED IN THE CONSPIRACY.

HOWEVER, THE STATE DID SAY IT WAS ITS CONTENTION THAT SHAW, LEE HARVEY OSWALD AND DAVID W. FERRIE MET IN FERRIE'S APARTMENT IN NEW ORLEANS DURING SEPTEMBER, 1963, AND DISCUSSED MEANS AND METHODS OF CARRYING OUT AN ASSASSINATION. OSWALD AND FERRIE ARE DEAD. KK736PCD SEPT. 6
