

# L.A. Man Named Warrant in JFK Probe

NEW ORLEANS — District Attorney Jim Garrison's office issued an "at large" arrest warrant today for Edgar Eugene Bradley, a Californian charged with conspiring to murder President Kennedy.

The arrest warrant was the first step toward extradition proceedings to get Bradley into Louisiana, where he could be prosecuted.

Bradley, who lives in North Hollywood, has denied any part in the Kennedy assassination.

## \$10,000 BOND

The warrant, sent to the criminal sheriff's office here, listed no address for Bradley. Assistant Chief Deputy Barney Kilbride said he could not act on the warrant until he knew officially where Bradley lives.

The warrant said bond for Bradley had been set at \$10,000.

On learning of Garrison's action against him, Bradley, 49, said in Los Angeles:

"This man is either being highly paid to do this or he's off his rocker."

He denied any part in the shooting of the late President, who was assassinated in Dallas Nov. 22, 1963.

Bradley in West Coast representative of Dr. Carl McIntire, a syndicated radio broadcaster and president of the International Council of Churches which has its headquarters at Collingswood, N.J.

McIntire is currently in a hassle over the renewal of a

license for a Pennsylvania radio station because several groups have said his radio program is anti-Negro and anti-Semitic.

Bradley is the second man charged by Garrison with conspiracy to murder Kennedy. A similar charge was filed against Clay L. Shaw, 54, a wealthy retired New Orleans business man, March 1. He awaits trial.

The official Warren Report said Kennedy was killed by a lone sniper, Lee Harvey Oswald. It said no credible evidence was found that anyone else was involved.

## CHARGES PLOT

Garrison contends there was a conspiracy involving several men, sponsored by extreme right wing political forces.

Bradley said that McIntire

"has been described as a right wing broadcaster."

"But I'm neither a right-wing extremist nor a left-wing extremist," Bradley added. "I don't know anything about Garrison or the Kennedy affair."

The charge does not name any of the "others" allegedly in on the conspiracy. It said he "did willfully and unlawfully conspire with others to murder John F. Kennedy."
