

L. A. 'Suspect' Named By Garrison Arraigned

LOS ANGELES — (UPI) — Edgar Eugene Bradley, 49, West Coast representative of a radio evangelist, was arraigned today in Municipal Court in connection with a Louisiana warrant accusing him of conspiring to kill President Kennedy.

He was released on his own recognizance without bail.

Bradley, who surrendered to sheriff Peter Pitchess, was taken before Judge David Aisenson for the arraignment.

Judge Aisenson continued the case for 30 days pending extradition proceedings by Louisiana authorities. Bradley was ordered to come back to court Jan. 29.

Bradley was accompanied by his attorney, George Jensen, who promised to fight extradition "tooth and nail."

The charges against Bradley were filed by New Orleans district attorney Jim Garrison.

Bradley has stated he was in Dallas only once in his life and that was last spring when he passed through there on a vacation trip.
