On radio interview of Lane and William Turner by Owen Spann, KGO, either Lane or Turner said that Robert Kennedy, before any interview, stipulates that no questions will be asked about the assassination. Spann confirmed that his station had been asked not to permit such questions of Kennedy.

Lane, L.A. Free Press, 19 Apr 68: "When Sen. Kennedy is invited to appear on a television interview program, my source here being two different producers of different television programs, his office requires an advance agreement that no question directly or indirectly related to the Warren Commission Report, Jim Garrison's investigation, or my book will be asked. If the program operates on a two-way format with viewers calling in with questions, then it must be agreed that all calls will be screened ... and no one who is interested in the assassination be permitted to ask his question."
