Shaw Trial Date

District Attorney Jim Garrison yesterday set January 21—the day after Richard Nixon is sworn in as President—for the beginning of the trial of Clay L. Shaw on charges of conspiring to assassinate President John F. Kennedy.

Shaw, 55, will go on trial in Orleans parish Criminal District Court in a jury trial presided over by Judge Edward Haggerty.

The United States Supreme Court earlier this week denied a restraining order denied all the charges. asked by Shaw against Gar-

rison which would have prohibited the district attorney from prosecuting him.

"The moment of truth has arrived in this case," Garrion told a news conference. "Even if I'm killed the Clay Shaw case will go to trial."

Shaw, former director of the New Orleans International Trade Mart, is accused of conspiring with Lee Harvey Oswald and "others" to kill Mr. Kennedy a few months before the President was shot to death in Dallas on November 22, 1963. Shaw has

concluded that Oswald alone killed the President. Garrison contends the assassina-tion was the result of a con-spiracy, and that Oswald may not even have been the assassin.
