With Autopsy 530

NEW ORLEANS AP — Release of a panel of medical experts' report on the autopsy of President John F. Kennedy by Atty. Gen. Ramsey Clark means that "we're getting the same old sleight of hand," says James Alcock, chief assistant to Dist. Atty. Jim Garrison.

"This obviously doesn't satisfy our subpoena," Alcock said Thursday night.

Garrison's office will press for autopsy documents, including photographs and Xrays, at a sessions court hearing in Washington today, Alcock said.

Alcock will handle the courtroom prosecution in the trial of Clay Shaw, 56, a retired New Orleans businessman charged with conspiring to assassinate Kennedy. The trial is scheduled to start Tuesday.

The report released in Washington concluded that Kennedy was shot twice from behind. Garrison maintains that the President was also struck by a bullet from the front.

The report supported findings of the Warren Commission which concluded Kennedy was shot by Lee Harvey Oswald acting alone.

Alcock said of the panel review, "it seems that they just don't have any confidence in the state," and physicians here who might testify as expert witnesses on the autopsy material.

Meantime, Garrison subpoenaed three federal agents Thursday to testify at Shaw's trial, apparently in an attempt to prove his theory that a conspiracy existed in Kennedy's death.

Attorneys for Shaw filed their first subpoenas also, including one for William Gurvich, who was Garrison's chief investigator during the probe in 1967 and has said the probe had no basis in fact.

The three subpoenaed by Garrison included Roy Kellerman of Bethesda, Md., a Secret Service agent who was riding in the car when Kennedy was killed in Dallas on Nov. 22, 1963.

Garrison also subpoenaed Lyndal L. Shaneyfelt of Alexandria, Va., a photography expert for the FBI, and Robert A. Frazier, Hillcrest Heights, Md., an FBI firearms expert.

Salvatore Panzeca, an attorney for Shaw, said Marina Oswald Porter, of Dallas Tex., widow of Oswald, will be subpoenaed to testify for the defense.
