

Now There's a Good Family Man

Never let it be said that Atty. Gen. Jack P. F. Gremillion, who is under Federal Grand Jury indictment for his dealings with the now bankrupt Louisiana Loan and Thrift Corp., is not a good family man.

On the contrary, one need only look at the way he has taken care of his son, Jack P. F. Jr., to find reassurance. Jack P. F. Jr. has been promoted by his father to the post of chief librarian of the attorney general's office in Baton Rouge.

The promotion, coincidentally we're sure, followed news reports that young Gremillion was making more money as an assistant librarian than the chief librarian, even though he was attending law school at the same time.

Since Indians aren't supposed to make more than chiefs, Papa Gremillion demoted the head librarian, Marina Warner, to assistant libra-

rian and installed his son in the No. 1 spot.

Young Gremillion makes \$550 a month, the assistant librarian, \$415 a month.

You can't blame young Gremillion for taking advantage of a good deal. After all, he's learning how to be a lawyer and a librarian. And what's more, he's getting an inside look at just how the attorney general's office operates, at least under his father.

All of which calls to mind the audit of Mr. Gremillion's office which Legislative Auditor J. B. Lancaster supposedly began making last December.

Two previous audits of Mr. Gremillion's office were started after 1959. One was completed, the other was not. Neither was published.

We think it's about time that an audit of Mr. Gremillion's office was made public.
