Jurors Call For Report On Mafia

The Orleans Parish Grand Jury has called the chairman of the mayor's advisory committee on crime and delinquency to come before it tomorrow to testify about the committee's report that organized crime is attempting to take over New Orleans' tourist industry and may be bidding for political power.

Ivor Trapolin, chairman of the committee, was invited toappear before the grand jury at 2 p. m. tomorrow.

Trapolin said he is "happy to appear" and will bring all the pertinent data the advisory committee amassed in putting together it's 13-page report released April 17.

It also pointed to recent meetings between a city employe and rackets figure Carlos Marcello as evidence that there may have been attempts "to gain influence over certain aspects of city affairs."

The mayor's advisory committee recommended that a number of steps be taken to combat the organized crime it says exists. Among its proposals:

—At least one investigative grand jury impaneled annually in Orleans Parish to deal solely with organized crime.

—Special prosecutors, counsel and investigators for the jury.
