

**JUDGE IN SHAW TRIAL
IS FOUND NOT GUILTY**

NEW ORLEANS, Jan. 26 (AP) —The judge who presided at the Clay Shaw conspiracy trial was acquitted Monday night on charges of providing women and sex movies for a stag party.

"I'm very happy," said Judge Edward A. Haggerty Sr. "That's all I'm going to say tonight."

The verdict was given by Judge Haggerty's colleague in the Criminal District Court here, Judge Matthew S. Braniff. A burst of applause from spectators in the courtroom greeted the verdict.

Judge Haggerty, who is 56 years old, was charged with soliciting for prostitution, obscenity and resisting arrest. The case was heard without a jury.

Judge Braniff ruled that the stag party, which was held in a midtown motel here last Dec. 17, was a private party and that the police had no right to raid it.
