

Top FBI Officer Here Retires After 29 Years

Robert E. Rightmyer will end 29 years' service with the Federal Bureau of Investigation Sept. 18 and be succeeded as special agent in charge of the New Orleans field office by Roland C. Halstead.

The announcement of Rightmyer's retirement came yesterday from FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover.

Rightmyer said he will continue to reside in New Orleans,
