

Volz Named Chief Aide To Garrison

District Atty. Jim Garrison today named attorney John Volz chief assistant DA, replacing now-judge James Alcock.

Volz, who has been an assistant DA for several years, took part in Garrison's investigation into the assassination of President Kennedy.

Alcock was named last week to replace ousted Judge Edward A. Haggerty Jr. on the Criminal District Court bench.

Garrison today also named three other attorneys to executive assistant posts in his office.

They are Andrew Sciambra, William R. Alford Jr. and Byron P. Legendre.

LL&T Figure Will Receive Separate Trial

Federal District Judge Frederick J. R. Heebe today ordered a separate trial for Baton Rouge attorney Joseph Kavanaugh, one of four men charged with Atty. Gen. Jack P. F. Gremillion in connection with the bankrupt Louisiana Loan and Thrift Corp.

The United States attorney's office asked for a separate trial for Kavanaugh "in the best interest of justice" and the defense agreed.

Gremillion, State Rep. Salvador Anzelmo, a former attorney for LL&T; Ernest A. Bartlett Jr., former chairman of the board of the corporation, and former President Charles H. Ritchey are scheduled for trial here Feb. 8.

No date was set for the trial of Kavanaugh.

They all are charged in a 16-count indictment with conspiracy, use of the mails to defraud, fraud in the sale of securities and sale of unregistered securities.

The indictment was returned Feb. 14, 1969, after a year-long investigation into the operations of the corporation.
