Garrison Accuses 2 Federal Officials Who Charged Him

NEW ORLEANS, July 6 (AP)

— District Attorney Jim Garrison today filed seven charges, including criminal mischief and malfeasance, against two Federal officials who filed Federal charges against him last week. They are the United States Attorney here, Gerald Gallinghouse, and John Wall, head of the Federal anticrime strike force here.

Mr. Garrison, in Criminal District Court, alleged that the Federal charges against him had been filed "in order to impute disgrace" to the District Attorney.

Mr. Garrison was charged last Wednesday with accepting payoffs to protect illegal gambling in connection with pinball machines in the area. In a statement yesterday he called the charges a frame-up and called the Government's case a "pollution of prejudice."

His charges against the Federal officials included criminal mischief, threatening a witness, malfeasance and inciting a felony. Most centered around Pershing U. Gervais, who was quoted at length in a 113-page affidavit that the government appended to its charges against Mr. Garrison.

According to the affidavit, Gervais was the payoff man who carried marked payoff money, which the Government says was recovered when Mr. Garrison was arrested.

Mr. Garrison, in his countermove, accused Mr. Gallinghouse and Mr. Wall of threatening Gervais "in order to obtain ad-

vantages from him so as to do harm to the District Attorney of New Orleans, Jim Garrison, and in order to impute disgrace to the said attorney."
