the hearing.

U.S. Atty. Gerald J. Gallinghouse agreed to supply the defense with some information, and Christenberry granted the motion only to his extent. Defense attorneys, not opposing the continuance, said they need time to study the information to be sumplied by the mation to be supplied by the government.
