

Bond Foresees Violence If Agnew 'Ranting' Continues

ATLANTIC CITY, N. J., Sept. 11 (AP)—Julian Bond, the only black member of the Georgia Legislature, said today that black Americans might have to "resort to force" if Vice-President Agnew and J. Edgar Hoover, director of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, "continued their rantings."

"If the provision of the inane Washington, D. C., no-knock law are any indication of what is in store for us in the future, and if the gate-mouthed Maryland farmer who presides over the Senate is to continue his rantings in concert with the little tyrant who runs the F.B.I.," Mr. Bond told the 12th Annual Summer Conference of the Philadelphia Bar Association, "then we must prepare for a time of trouble."
