Republican figures critical of President Nixon's policies plan to meet early next month to discuss their future "insurgency" activities, former Senator Charles E. Goodell of New York disclosed today.

The meeting could end up being an "organizational meeting" of anti-Nixon Republicans, Mr. Goodell said.

Over breakfast with a group of reporters, the former Republican Senator, who was defeated last November with the help of the Administration, said that participants in the meeting would include Representatives Paul N. McCloskey Jr. of California, who had indicated that he may challenge Mr. Nixon in the Republican Presidential primaries next year, and Donald W. Riegle Jr. of Michigan.

"I would say that Mr. Nixon is in trouble with this Republican group on the war, on the economy, on the cities and on the environment," Mr. Goodell said.
