

JAPANESE SEE NIXON DUE IN CHINA MONDAY

TOKYO, Sept. 20 (UPI)—Asahi Shimbun, Japan's largest newspaper, said yesterday that President Nixon would fly directly to Peking after he meets with the Japanese Emperor in Anchorage, Alaska, on Sunday.

The newspaper said in a dispatch from Washington that Mr. Nixon would travel to Peking the next day, Sept. 27 from Alaska aboard the Presidential plane following his meeting with Emperor Hirohito. The article attributed its information to diplomatic sources in Washington.

It quoted the sources as having said that Mr. Nixon had no definite fixed schedules on Sept. 28, 29 and Oct. 1, and that on those days the President would be in Peking meeting with Premier Chou En-lai and the party chairman, Mao Tse-tung.

President and Mrs. Nixon will fly to Alaska from Washington to meet Emperor Hirohito, who will make a brief stop there en route to a visit to European countries.

WASHINGTON, Sept. 20—Ronald L. Zeigler, the White House press secretary, denied for the third consecutive day reports from Japanese press agencies that President Nixon would fly directly from Anchorage to Peking. Mr. Ziegler said the President would return to Washington the next morning, Sept. 27, and aides said that Mr. Nixon would maintain a full schedule on Sept. 28, 29, and Oct. 1.
