Nixon Administration took note today of North Vietnam's decision to make public its own nine-point peace plan, but declined any specific comment.
Ronald L. Ziegler, the White House press secretary, told reporters late today that the Administration's Vietnam specialists were "in the process of reviewing" the North Vietnamese statements. He said he would respond to puestions on the matter tomorrow.

"We didn't feel we could do it ourselves," one specialist said, "but now that they have done it, the American public can see precisely what the other side has been demanding of us."
