13-0 OK to
Kleindienst

WASHINGTON — (UPI) — The Senate Judiciary Committee by a vote of 13-0 today approved President Nixon's nomination of Richard Kleindienst to succeed John Mitchell as Attorney General. Senate confirmation appears certain.

The committee chairman, Sen. James Eastland (D-Miss.), said he expected the nomination to be reported to the Senate floor "next Tuesday or Wednesday."

Kleindienst is now deputy Attorney General, the No. 2 man in the Justice Department, and shares many of Mitchell's views on law and order and wiretapping.

Kleindienst, 48, is a former organizer for Sen. Barry Goldwater.
