Paris Meet Tomorrow

PARIS — (AP) — The Communist delegations to the Vietnam peace talks agreed today to a U.S.-South Vietnamese proposal to meet tomorrow for the first time in three weeks.

The United States refused to meet Feb. 17 because of the anti-American Vietnam peace meeting being held that week at Versailles. As soon as the conference re-

sumed Feb. 24, the North Vietnamese and Viet Cong walked out in protest against American bombing of North Vietnam.

The United States and South Vietnam refused to meet for the next two weeks because of the Communist walkout and "the tone and content of recent official announcements from Hanoi," which were sharply critical of President Nixon.
