RICHARD M. NIXON: THE MAN WHO BROUGHT US . . .

- . . . six percent unemployment and the highest increase in food prices in 14 years.
- . . . the war in Laos and Cambodia.
- . . . wiretapping, preventive detention and no-knock.
- . . . importation of Rhodesian chromium ore in support of racism and in violation of international law.
- . . . simultaneous states of recession, unemployment and inflation.
- . . . the highest interest rates in 100 years.
- . . . tax cuts and loopholes for business and the wealthy.
- . . . billions of dollars of military waste.
- . . . the veto of legislation which would have produced 200,000 useful jobs in the midst of an unemployment crisis.
- . . . the veto of the landmark child development bill.
- . . . vetoes of the mine safety bill, manpower training bill and campaign spending bill.
- . . . vetoes of funds for education and hospitals.
- . . . Spiro Agnew and his unprecedented attack on the nation's media.
- . . . H. R. Haldeman and his accusation that Vietnam war critics are "consciously aiding and abetting the enemy."
- . . . Richard Kleindienst and the marriage of corporate interests and political power.
- . . . Earl Butz and his "let them eat steak" attitude on soaring meat prices for consumers.

LOOK WHAT HE'S DONE TO INDOCHINA

Nixon was elected President after promising to end U.S. involvement in Vietnam with a "secret plan." But where is that plan?

Under the Nixon Administration . . .

20,000 more Americans and hundreds of thousands of North and South Vietnamese have died in Indochina.

The war has been expanded into Laos and Cambodia.

Millions of tons of bombs have been rained on Indochina—more than were dropped on three continents during all of World War II and the Korean War combined.

2 million more Indochinese civilians have become refugees fleeing the battlefields.

"Vietnamization" has meant lower weekly American death tolls but continued Asian ones.



LOOK WHAT HE'S DONE TO OUR HEALTH, EDUCATION, WELFARE, FREEDOMS AND RIGHTS

Nixon's health plan seeks only to regulate the health insurance industry and not to meet the crisis in health care delivery.

Nixon has recommended that Medicare hospital benefits be sharply reduced.

Nixon twice vetoed bills to increase federal funding of our schools, including tens of millions to aid disadvantaged children.

Nixon vetoed the landmark comprehensive child development bill.

Nixon's demagogic call for a law to limit the courts' power to enforce the 14th Amendment is an unconstitutional attack on civil rights.

Under the Nixon Administration . . .

The Army, FBI and IRS have investigated political dissenters. Congressmen, newsmen, clergymen and union officials have also been subject to surveillance.

Nixon has withheld \$12 billion of federal money already appropriated by Congress for social programs.

Nixon's 1973 budget earmarks more than \$5 billion for highways and a scant \$390 million for mass transportation.

Nixon ordered an expansion of the functions of the Subversive Activities Control Board.

Nixon opposed the creation of an independent consumer protection agency to act on behalf of the consumer.

Nixon opposed the landmark water pollution bill passed by the Senate in favor of a far weaker House bill.

Under the Nixon Administration . . .

The government attempted to suppress the Pentagon Papers, engaged in mass arrest of innocent bystanders during Mayday demonstrations and increased the use of "national security" wiretapping.

LOOK WHAT HE'S DONE TO OUR ECONOMY

Under the Nixon Administration . . .

Wages are controlled, but prices, rents and profits are rising rapidly.

Unemployment rose from 3.4 percent to 6.1 percent.

1972 food prices rose their highest in 14 years, led by the price of meat which jumped 11.2 percent over last year.

The number of people living in poverty increased for the first time in a decade.

While at the same time . . .

Business loopholes have been enlarged, amounting to a 15 percent tax cut for corporations.
