KISSINGER, IN CHINA, HAS LATE-HOUR TALK

PEKING, Friday, June 23—
Henry A. Kissinger, President
Nixon's adviser for national
security, traveled to a corner
of the Forbidden City last
night for an extended meeting
with Chinese leaders, possibly
his last before leaving for
Washington some time today.
The meeting began after dinner and lasted until past midnight, raising to more than 12
hours the amount of time spent
in talks since Mr. Kissinger
arrived here Monday.
Correspondents were alerted
to the late-night session by the
line of security men and soldiers strung out along a threemile route from the rear of the
Forbidden City, where Government offices are, to the state
guest house where Mr. Kissinger and his party are
staying.
It was considered highly
improbable that Mr. Kissinger
was meeting with Chairman
Mao Tse-tung, who has not received any foreign visitors
since his meeting with President Nixon in February. It was
thought likely that Mr. Kissinger was meeting with
Premier Chou En-lai.
