Nixon Security Adequate

Washington - (AP) - Because security is adequate the two top U.S. Secret Service officials say it doesn't seem likely that the President would have to use an escape tunnel if a mob attempted to storm the White House.

James J. Rowley the Secret Service director and Thomas J. Kelly assistant director testified yesterday in U.S. District Court where the American Civil Liberties Union is challenging the legality of a regulation limiting the number of demonstrators in front of the White House.

The ACLU contends the numerical limit imposed in 1967 is not to prevent harm to the President but to prevent protests against him.
