

M.I.T. CENTER GETS AID FROM THE C.I.A.

CAMBRIDGE, Mass., April 17 (AP)—The Center for International Studies at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology receives funds from the Central Intelligence Agency, but not for the type of work Michigan State University has done in Vietnam,

the center's director said Sunday.

"We are a research organization," Max Millikan reported. "We do not engage in overseas operations."

Last week it was disclosed that C.I.A. men had been members of a Michigan State group engaged in an aid project in Vietnam.

Mr. Millikan said that "a very small fraction" of the cen-

ter's \$750,000 annual budget was financed by C.I.A. funds. The money is used, he said, for "academic, mainly library research resulting in regular publication of our studies."

He declined to disclose, however, which publications had been supported by Government funds, saying "the same standards of objectivity and scholarship apply to all our work."
