

**LAWYER IS DISMISSED
IN RAID ON OFFICES**

WASHINGTON, July 22 (AP) — President Nixon's campaign organization has dismissed a lawyer who refused to answer questions by Federal Bureau of Investigation agents in connection with a break-in at Democratic National Headquarters.

G. Gordon Liddy, an attorney for the finance division of the Committee for the Re-election of the President, was discharged June 28, De Van L. Shumway, director of public affairs, said Saturday.

The reason for the dismissal, Mr. Shumway said, was "because he elected not to respond

to certain questions by F.B.I. agents in relation to the incident at Democratic national headquarters."

"It is our policy that all employees cooperate fully with appropriate law enforcement officials in the conduct of this investigation," he added.

Five men were arrested May 15 in the headquarters of the Democratic National Committee, including James W. McCord Jr., security coordinator for the re-election committee. The five had bugging equipment with them when they were arrested.

Mr. Liddy, reached at his home in Oxon Hill, Md., said: "I do not want to speak with any member of the press on any subject."

The F.B.I. refused comment.
