

MacGregor Hocks McGovern Plans

Washington, Aug. 10 - Clark MacGregor, President Nixon's campaign director [speaking to the National Press Club,] attacked the Democratic Presidential nominee with his own words today, imploring Senator George McGovern to "come home, George," from what he termed a "giveaway" welfare program, "massive and reckless" defense cuts and a "begging" foreign policy.

During a question period that followed the luncheon

that followed the luncheon speech, Mr. MacGregor described the break-in at Democratic National Headquarters in June by five men with eavesdropping equipment as "absolutely idiotic, wholly unauthorized and bizarre."

Asked about a \$25,000 check to the Nixon campaign that has been traced to the bank account of one of those arrested in the incident, Mr. MacGregor said that he was "satisfied that the \$25,000 was properly and lawfully contributed" to the campaign and that the "proceeds [have been] accounted for in a report to the General Accounting Office by Maurice Stans," the former Commerce Secretary who is the chief fund-raiser for President Nixon's re-election campaign.

Phillip S. Hughes, head of the office of Federal elections of the accounting office, refused to comment until the agency's investigation was completed.
