Broker's Illegal Aid to Humphrey

John L. Loeb, senior part-ner of a stock brokerage, pleaded no contest yesterday to federal charges of unlawful, indirect contribu-tions to the 1972 presidential nomination campaign of Senator Hubert H. Hum-


phrey (Dem-Minn.).

Loeb faces up to three years in prison and \$3000 in fines.

He insisted he had not known that \$48,000 in campaign donations, made through nine employees of Loeb, Rhoades and Co., whom he reimbursed, were illegal.

Loeb, 70, admitted arranging the primary campaign contributions by three em-ployees, and then reimbursing their bank accounts with checks from his personal accounts.

the first such prosecution for violation of the federal election campaign act of 1971.
