

Wallace Opponent Calls for Inquiry

Dothan, Ala., June 13 (AP) - A wealthy Alabama businessman who ran third in the Democratic primary race for governor in 1970 has asked for an official investigation of the reported use of Republican funds in an unsuccessful attempt to defeat Gov. George C. Wallace.

Millionaire Charles Woods of Dothan said today a former GOP national committeemember, James D. Martin, told him "the White House" wanted Wallace defeated in 1970 for a second term as governor "to keep him out of the 1972 presidential race."

Woods said he was told by other sources that more than \$200,000 was sent into Alabama "by the Nixon administration" in an effort to win the gubernatorial nomination for former Gov. Albert Brewer.
