Ehrlichman Says He Has Records

BOSTON — (UPI) — Former presidential aide John D. Ehrlichman says he has records which will trip up John Dean, whose testimony before the Senate Watergate Committee linked President Nixon with attempts to cover up the scandal.

Ehrlichman, the President's former domestic adviser, in an interview in the Christian Science Monitor said his records show that "literally months went by during the time Dean was talking about that I had no contact with him at all."

According to Dean, Ehrlichman said, "he was in and out of my office every 10 minutes. He says, however, he has no written rec-

ords. Well, I do. And Dean will be tripped up by the logs I kept of all meetings."

Ehrlichman's comments give an indication the direction his testimony will take when he appears before the committee in late July.

Dean has said the President, Ehrlichman and former White House chief of staff H. R. Haldeman knew what he was doing as far as the attempt to cover up the Watergate break-in.

Ehrlichman claimed there was no Watergate coverup on the part of the President, Haldeman and himself because they were not aware until March 21 there was any White House involvement that needed covering up. Both Ehrlichman and Haldeman resigned April 30.
