

Ehrlichman, Krogh Probed by State Bar

SEATTLE, Wash., July 11 (UPI)—The Washington Bar Association, acting on complaints from members, today announced an investigation of the role in the Watergate affair of former presidential adviser John D. Ehrlichman and White House aide Egil (Bud) Krogh Jr.

Charles I. Stone, president of the association, said its disciplinary board will decide on further action, if any, against the two attorneys who practiced in Seattle before joining the Nixon administration.

Stone said in a statement that in addition to publicity about the involvement of Ehrlichman and Krogh in Watergate, "formal complaints have been made to the bar association about the two men."
