

# Bebe Rebozo Records Said Audited by IRS

The Internal Revenue Service has audited some of the personal financial records of Charles G. (Bebe) Rebozo, President Nixon's close personal friend, a Miami television station has reported.

Auditors from the IRS, armed with subpoenas, spent at least two days going over Rebozo's personal accounts at the Key Biscayne Bank & Trust Co., which Rebozo heads, according to WPLG-TV in Miami.

Auditors from the IRS, armed with subpoenas, spent at least two days going over Rebozo's personal accounts at the Key Biscayne Bank & Trust Co., which Rebozo heads, according to WPLG-TV in Miami.

Rebozo, who lives next to the presidential compound at Key Biscayne, was with the President yesterday at Camp David. Md. A White House spokesman said Rebozo has issued no comment in response to the television station's report.

According to the television report, about four IRS auditors were at the bank on Friday July 13, and Monday July 16, at a time when Rebozo was not in the Miami area. The extent of the audit and the reasons it was undertaken were not known, the station said.

Bank officials could not be reached for comment yesterday. Christopher O'Sullivan, an official of the bank, earlier had refused to comment to a reporter from WPLG-TV and had stood in the bank door to prevent a television film crew from entering the bank.

Rebozo funded the bank in 1964 and is now listed as its president and chairman of the board. It is the only bank on Key Biscayne.

Among the other directors of the bank is millionaire Robert Abplanalp, another close friend of the President, who helped finance the purchase of Mr. Nixon's home in San Clemente, Calif. Abplanalp was named a director of the bank on March 10, 1971, according to the television report.
