

## Police Group Asks Pledge For Nixon

SAVANNAH, Ga., Dec. 28 (AP)—George DuMas, national director of public affairs for the American Federation of Police, has launched a nationwide campaign to drum up support for President Nixon.

DuMas, 57, said Thursday that he started the campaign several weeks ago "because so many people and organizations were working to impeach the President."

"Law enforcement is this nation's first line of defense," DuMas said. "Our official head is the President. He is the embodiment of everything American. When they attack him, they attack this country."

DuMas said he has mailed 100,000 postcards to individuals throughout the nation, asking them to sign a pledge of support for the President on the card and mail it to the White House.

In addition, DuMas said, Jim Lockett, a real estate man in Richmond, Va., is directing a newspaper advertising campaign.

"I sent him 5,000 pieces of mail just yesterday," DuMas said. "It all came in the few days just before Christmas. We are getting such response that I am going to have to incorporate, because we can't handle it all here at my apartment."

Lockett said in Richmond that about \$110 has been raised in contributions and he has spent about \$200 on ads. He said he put up \$80 himself.
