

Nixon Subpoena Stuck in the Mail

Superior Court Judge Gordon Ringer said yesterday he was "rendered speechless" by news that a subpoena he issued for President Nixon's testimony last week has not yet arrived in the Washington, D.C., Superior Court although it was mailed February 4.

Ringer's clerk, informed of the development, telephoned the Los Angeles Post Office, which agreed to place a tracer on the enve-

lope, which was sent by registered mail.

Public defender Charles Gessler, representing G. Gordon Liddy in the Daniel Ellsberg burglary case, raised the possibility that a hearing February 22 at which the President is deemed a material witness might have to be postponed if the subpoena is not found soon. Mr. Nixon's testimony was requested by another defendant in the case, former presidential adviser John D. Ehrlichman.
