WASHINGTON — The White House yesterday challenged a statement by a Ralph Nader attorney that President Nixon's version of his 1971 meeting with dairy leaders "does not appear to be exact" when compared with a subpoenaed tape re-

cording of the meeting.

The attorney, William A.
Dobrovir, who earlier obtained a tape of the meeting, filed a five-page motion in

U.S. District Court Friday questioning the White House version and saying "the difference could be crucial."

The Administration reversed itself two days after the March 23, 1971, meeting and raised the federal support price for raw milk. Nader filed suit to roll back the increase on grounds it was influenced by a \$437,000 campaign contribution from the dairy industry.
