

Kissinger, Rockefeller Get Together

Secretary of State Henry Kissinger has met privately with presidential hopeful Nelson Rockefeller.

Last week Kissinger hurried out to Rockefeller's home here for an unpublicized huddle. Their friendship is touchy because Kissinger worked for Rocky, former governor of New York, and against Richard Nixon in the battle for the 1968 presidential nomination.

Whether or not the recent powwow involved 1976, it must have been important. Rocky and his wife, Happy, had flown from New York for a Washington Press Club dinner, touching base at their home with barely enough time to change clothes before the event.

A Kissinger intimate in the audience revealed that he is worried and edgy over the damage Watergate may do Kissinger's reputation.
