Post Is Going to Have Its Problems' - Nixon

Following is part of the material omitted from the White House transcript of a Sept. 15, 1972, conversation between President Nixon, his chief of staff, H. R. Haldeman, and his counsel, John W. Dean III. The material was obtained from sources involved in the House Judiciary volved in the House Judiciary Committee's investigation of grounds for the impeachment of Mr. Nixon.
