## Predicts Defeat of Impeac

HONOLULU, May 17-Vice President Ford expressed the belief here today that a majority of the House of Represent-atives would not favor im-peachment of President Nixon even if the House Judiciary Committee voted for it.
At the same time he urged

Ford sidestepped a definite stand on whether he thinks the President should defy the subpoena and said he believes the committee should consider whether the additional mate-rial it seeks is actually relevant and essential.

The Vice President said the committee already has a great deal of material, and said he believes it has enough on which to base a decision. He said it should wait until it has considered all the material it already has before determin-ing whether more is needed. "At this later stage I hope

the White House would cooperate," he said. "But this stage has not yet been reached."

He said committe counsel John Doar and White House counsel James D. St. Clair should consult on the question of the need for new material, and implied that a narrowing of committee demands might be the basis for an agreement for the White House to meet committee requests.
