

Nader Asks Milk Deal Suit

Washington.

A lawyer for consumer advocate Ralph Nader charged yesterday that President Nixon appears to have been the leader of a dairy cooperative conspiracy to commit \$2 million to his 1972 re-election campaign in exchange for increased milk price supports. In a four-

page letter, William O. Dobrovir, the lawyer, urged U.S. Attorney Carl J. Silbert to begin "a diligent inquiry" and to file a civil suit to recover funds that were lost to the Federal Government because of fraud in the conspiracy.

Dobrovir said he sent a copy to Attorney General

William B. Saxbe and made "a similar demand on him."

Nader, through Dobrovir, has fought for months in U.S. District Court to roll back a 1971 increase in the Federal price support for raw milk on grounds it was an Administration payoff for the \$2 million commitment.
