

UAW Issues a Call for Nixon's Impeachment

About 3000 members of the United Auto Workers, representing the nation's largest industrial union, issued a nearly unanimous call yesterday for the impeachment of President Nixon.

The international convention of the 1.4-million-member union passed the resolution with only few hands raised in opposition. No exact count was taken.

"The UAW urges the House of Representatives to vote articles of impeachment and to send the case of Richard Nixon to trial in the Senate," the resolution said. "We urge the Senate, if impeachment is voted, to try the case with dispatch, courage and fairness.

"If the evidence showed

Richard Nixon to be guilty of treason, bribery or other high crimes and misdemeanors, the Senate must convict him."
