The Federal Election Cam-SETS 3-YEAR LIMIT paign Act, signed by President Ford Oct. 16, retroactively WASHINGTON, Nov. 8 (UPI)

A loophole in the new campaign finance law permits those who made and received illegal campaign contributions during the 1972 Congressional races to avoid prosecution, a spokesman for the Watergate prosecutors said today.

It also puts pressure on the special Watergate prosecutor, Henry S. Ruth, to speed indictaments for campaign contributions during the 1972 congressional races indicted once the law goes into effet Jan. 1.

This means the Justice Department and the special prosecutor's office will have to act within six weeks to indict those who made or received illegal contributions between January and April, 1972.
