Watergate's McCord Ends Prison Term

Allenwood, Pa.

Watergate burglar James W. McCord Jr. yesterday left the Allenwood federal prison farm where he had served an abbreviated sentence for the bugging incident.

McCord, whose letter to a federal judge broke open the Watergate scandal, evaded reporters on leaving the minimum-security institution.

McCord, who entered Allenwood on March 22, had been sentenced to one to five years. But last April 29, U.S. District Court Judge John J. Sirica reduced the sentence to four months, making him eligible for parole in two months.
