Mr. Nixon [gave] a glittering farewell banquet in Peking, in which acting Premier

Hua Kuo-feng urged closer U.S.-China ties, reminding his host it was during the Nixon

presidency that renewed U.S.-China ties began. Mr. Nicon told the Peking banquet:

Nixon [voice]: We have begun to build a great bridge, a bridge that will reach all the way

from the Golden Gate of California to the golden Gate of Heavenly Peace in Peking.

Mr. Nixon leaves for Canton, China, tomorrow. Earlier today Mr. Nixon denied he'd made statements in Peking critical of U.S. foreign policy.

.... On Capitol Hill, Secretary Kissinger was asked how he views the Nixon trip.

Kissinger [voice]: In my role as Secretary of State, we obviously prefer to [word missed; deal?] with other governments through official channels.

But Rissinger said he welcomes any statement the Chinese make.
