The purported mastermind of the Watergate break-in, G. Gordon Liddy, has been transferred from the medium security Federal prison in Danbury, Conn., to the minimum security prison farm at Allenwood, Pa. Mr. Liddy, whose sentence is from six years eight months to 20 years imprisonment for his part in Watergate, has spent 46 months in prison and will not be eligible for parole until May 1981. At Allenwood there are no guard towers or fences, and prisoners are eligible for furloughs of up to seven days. His lawyer, Peter Maroulis, said that Mr. Liddy was told late Tuesday that he would be transferred from Danbury, and left the prison on Wednesday.
