I taped Weicher on Mett the Press. I'll hold the tape until I hear that you caught the show. I found much to my liking in it but have no reason to keep the tape.

Weicher presents himself as a man of highest principle. Perhaps he is and perhaps this is him dominating motive. However, I can find one easier to believe and more compelling should he turn out to be less noble in spirit: his own political needs and GOP political expediency. This is what I have been feeling for some time. The GOPs who have to stand for election gan't survive Watergate. They fear even more the potential of this dirtyworks that has not yet come to light. So, while they may all be indignant and offended at this subversion, they have a more practical problem, their own futures. This leaves them little, almost no coice.

I believe this was the most emphasized, the most repeated single point. Weicher from the first drew a sharp distinction between the RNC and the Dreeps. He called them "creeps", to Lil's satisfaction. He also made clear the identity of personnel and control Creep and White House personnel. He fell short of what he has said in private about Haldeman, but he lefft little doubt, I think, that he believes Haldeman was the honcho.

I found interesting the manner in which he defended the Bresident and said GL had nothing to do with this endeavor. It is not because GL is so pure in soul, so incapable of dirtydickery. It is because he was too busy! How much more dedicated to the GL can one be than Weicher is? Again, re-election needs, not love or respect, so perish the thought, GL could not have been party to this.

It is also interesting that he managed to disclose nothing new. This suggests that he may not be the committee's leak. The leaks can serve the purpose of undermining the committee and faith in what it says, so maybe it is Baker? He is closer to GL.

Neither reporter raised the questionx of John's Other Life. Finally George Herman did. Nobody raised any Martha Toves John questions, despite its sort of sensational part of today's news (except in the Washington Post, which made no mention, with more than four columns, mostly rehash, on WG and L.Pat.)

Weicher took a strict position: he wants proof or corroboration of hearsay. Leave
