Whe New Orleans search slips disclose records destroyed. It is not as simple as giving us the search slips is intended to make it appear. And why should they have destroyed any Gerrison record? any Osweld record?

I will want you to take this up with "etcalfe before you leave and I want to put together what he should be asked to do. It will, at the least, induce sopies of the requests for authorization, any authorization, and compliance with FEI re ulations, which mean that the sement information must remain available in other records. I've seen many such forms and have a number, where the records destroyed are listed and the source of that inform is stated.

Of course, the historical case prohibition applies, so we have to recognize that they'll stonewall because they'll know this was destroyed so that it would not have to be disclosed.

No matter how they lie mi it will not be credible and perhaps, with the spectro case destructions, it will get some attention.
