Text of Ford's Statement

WASHINGTON, Dec. 19 (AP)—Following is the text of President Ford's statement today on the Senate vote cut-ting off funds for covert United States military aid in Angola:

The Senate decision to cut off additional funds for An-gola is a deep tragedy for all countries whose security depends on the United States. Ultimately, it will profoundly affect the securi-ty of our country as well How can the United States, the greatest power in the

ty of our country as wen How can the United States, the greatest power in the world, take the position that the Soviet Union can operate with impunity many thou-sands of miles away with Cuban troops and massive amounts of military equip-ment, while we refuse any assistance to the majority of the local people who ask only for Military equipment to defend themselves? The issue in Angola is not, never has been and never will be a question of the use of U.S. forces. The sole issue is the provision of

issue is the provision of modest amounts of assis-tance to oppose military in-tervention by two extracontinental powers, namely the Soviet Union and Cuba.

Soviet Union and Cuba. This abdication of respon-sibility by a majority of the Senate will have the gravest consequences for the long-term position of the United States and for international order in general. A great

nation cannot escape its responsibilities. Responsibili-ties abandoned today will return as more acute crises tomorrow.

I therefore call on the Sen-ate to reverse its position before it adiourns. Failure to do so will, in my judg-ment, seriously damage the national interest of the Unit-ed States. ed States.
