If We Backed the M.P.L.A. To the Editor:

Secretary of State Kissinger's pre-occupation with "confronting" the Soviet Union in Angola is a prescription for American failure in sub-Saharan Africa. He should know that the appearance of American collabothe appearance of American collabo-ration with South Africa against An-golans will antagonize most of the continent, regardless of the merits of the contending factions. One policy alternative is for the United States to throw its support to the MPLA (now assisted by the

United States to throw its support to the M.P.L.A. (now assisted by the Soviet Union) and achieve the follow-ing objectives: (1) a quicker end to hostilities in Angola; (2) influence with the M.P.L.A. the probable win-ners in the suggle for power, and (3) neutralization of Soviet influence in Angola. All three objectives are in (5) neutralization of

(3) neutralization of Soviet influence in Angola. All three objectives are in the interest of the people of Angola and of the United States Government.
